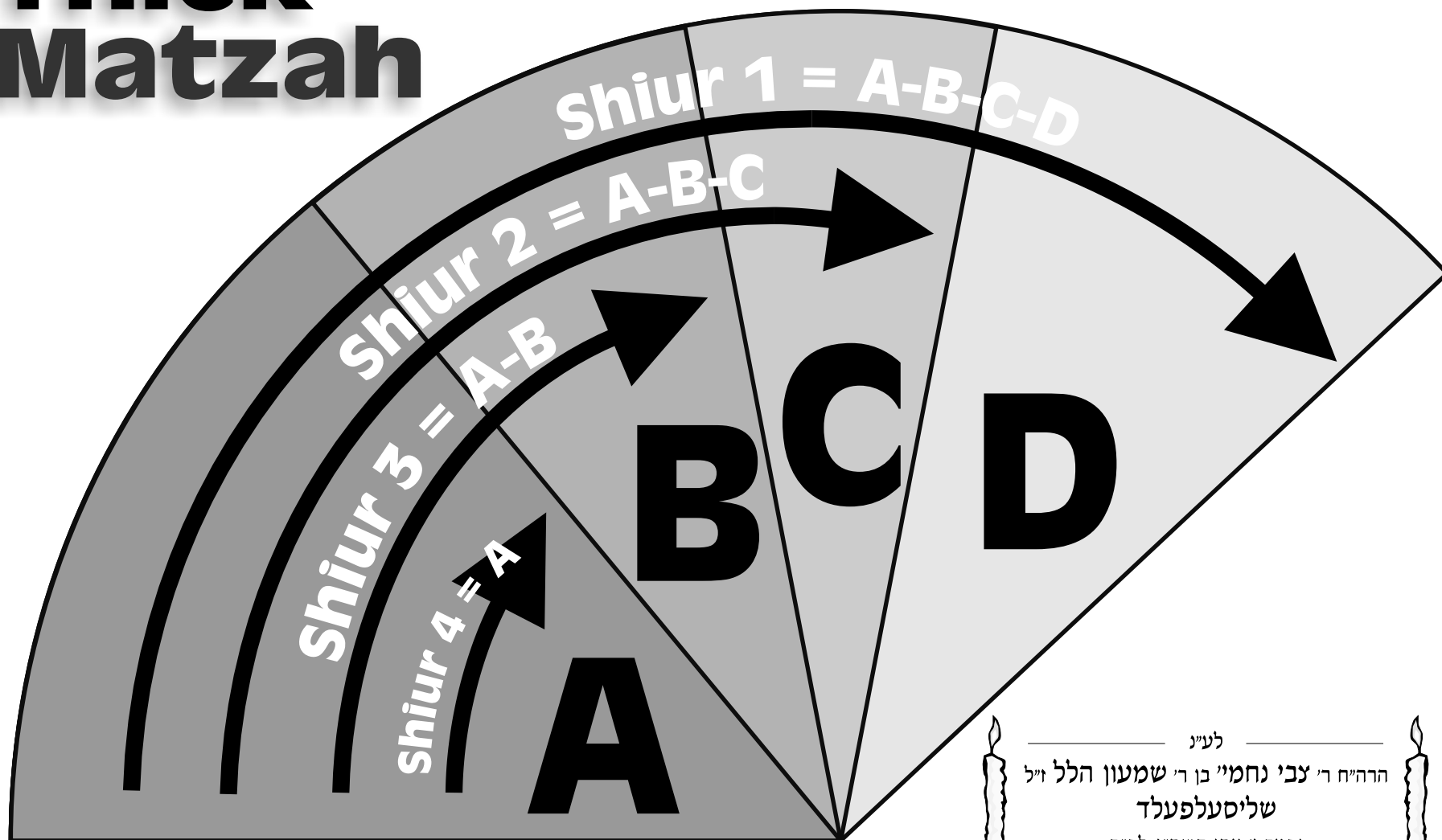


Thick Matzah

- * Sources and explanations for the Shiurim can be found in our publication "Going ForWarD" 5762.
- * Some authorities state that one should add a little to these amounts to compensate for Matza stuck between the teeth.
- * The Shiur given for Moitzi Matza (the entire picture) is one K'zayis of the most stringent opinion (Chanzan Ish Z"l). Although one should preferably consume two K'zaisim. One for Moitzi and another for Matza, the Poskim rule that one such large Shiur suffices, since this big Shiur is technically twice as large as the smallest Shiur. Use half of this amount from the upper Matzah and the second for the middle.
- * These measurements have been reviewed agreed upon by Rabbi Menachem Meir Weismandl Shlit"a head of the FWD Rabbinical Advisory Board, and by Rabbi Yisroel Pinchos Bodner Shlit'a author of Halachos of K'zayis.

This picture is based on a thick and heavy Matzah, which will fit 6 Matzahs per pound (and has a diameter of 12 ¾ inch, thickness of 0.12 of an inch, and weighs approximately 72 grams.)
For a thin Matzah see reverse side.
 For a average Matzah the size will be somewhere in between these two graphs.
